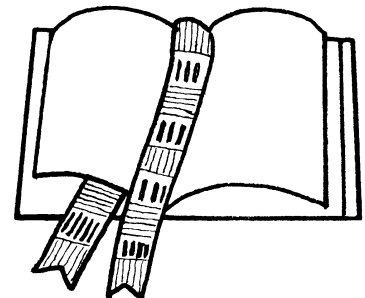

Zucchini Nachos

3 lg zucchinis sliced	1/4C vegetable oil	salt and pepper
1/2 onion diced	1/2 pepper, chopped	1 lg pepper tomato diced
1 lb ground beef, chicken or turkey	1/2 tsp. cumin	1/4 tsp chili powder
1 cp shredded cheddar cheese	(1 jalapeno or avocado optional)	

Preheat oven to 400. place sliced zucchinis in a large baking sheet in a single layer. Toss with 2 T oil, salt and pepper. Bake approx. 5 min. Sauté onion and pepper, then cook meat in same pan then season with cumin and chili powder. Remove zucchini from oven and turn broiler on high.. Top zucchini with beef mixture and cheese. Place back in the oven and bake until cheese is melted. Top with tomatoes, avocado, and jalapenos.
