

Rhubarb Fritters

1C flour 2C finely chopped fresh or frozen rhubarb, thawed

1C Sugar +1T more 1/2 tsp salt

2 eggs, separated oil for deep-frying

1/2C milk powdered sugar

1T melted butter or margarine

In a medium bowl, combine flour, 1 cp sugar and salt. In another bowl, whisk egg yokes, milk and butter. Gradually add to dry ingredients, stirring until smooth. Toss rhubarb with 1 tbl sugar: gently stir into batter. In a mixing bowl beat egg whites until stiff. Fold into batter. Heat oil to 375. Drop batter by tablespoonsful into oil. Fry a few at a time, turning with a slotted spoon until golden brown. Drain on paper towels. Dust with powder sugar. Serve Warm. Yield: 3 dozen
