

Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm by President, Rahn Siemonsma.

Mission statement read by all.

Devotions: Lorrie, Joyce Meyer, Joy of Believing Prayer

Council Secretary Report: Approved via email.

Financial Secretary Report:

Globe offering increased last month, offerings will be designated for Sunday School student project sponsorship.

Motion made by Wendy, second by Natalie to approve and place on file, motion passed.

Treasurer's Report:

Total giving for September lower than projected, year to date financials show larger deficit than projected due to increased building expenses (air conditioner repair and pastoral compensation. Year to date deficit \$15,000 more than budgeted for the year.

Natalie to approve, Dave second. Motion passed.

Pastor's Report:

Worship: Advent services start in November. Three services to include soup suppers prior. Crystal will play for Advent. Christmas Eve service planning; one service planned for 5 pm. Blue Christmas service planned for Wednesday, December 21st.

Learning Opportunities and Fellowship: Fall theological conference in Pierre, Pastor had the opportunity to lead worship.

Other: Youth group meetings resumed, new members have joined the congregation and transferred membership. 5 students confirmed at the end of October. Pastor Laura is planning vacation for the end of October and has arranged pulpit supply.

Motion made by Mike, second by Wendy to approve and place on file, motion passed.

Board of Deacons:

Most lay leader service activities are covered for October.

Board of Trustees:

Intek carpet cleaning quote \$430 for two large rooms in basement, \$545 upstairs. Will consider a second bid. Discussion that downstairs rooms should be prioritized first to prevent any mold or health issues. Motion by Lori to approve trustees to move forward with carpet cleaning once all bids received. Deanne second. Motion passed.

Executive Board:

Portico Health Benefits selection entered for the year. Life, Disability and. Pastor Laura waives health insurance coverage. Review of recommendations for 2023 include cost of \$10K (look up)

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\$880 monthly health stipend, need to confirm this amount is still adequate.

Executive Board recommends 8% increase in base salary increase for Pastor Laura. The increase is within the recommended years of service by the SD Synod guidelines. SD Synod guidelines are recommendations not requirements for congregations however, is best practice to review.

Social Security offset (allowance) is provided to Pastor as separate line item.

Motion by Deanne to increase Pastoral Compensation by 8% to include in budget for 2023, second by Dave. Discussion included recognition that there is value in being able to consider an increase.

motion passed.

Budget planning for 2023 will begin for draft review at November meeting.

Musician compensation review recommendation for 2023. Motion made by Rahn to increase musician compensation for 6.25% increase. Deanne second. No discussion, motion passed.

Czechoslovakian Cookies

6 hard-boiled egg yoks 3C flour


1C sugar 1 Tbl brandy

1C butter 2 eggs

1/2 lb finely chopped almonds

(4 Tbl sugar 1 tsp cinnamon)

Mash egg yolks in bowl until smooth. Add sugar and butter cream together. Add beaten 2 whole eggs, brandy, flour and half of the nuts. (Reserve rest for topping): toss half dough on floured board and roll out fairly thin. Cut with cookie cutters or into oblong strips. Place on buttered cookie sheet. Brush with beaten eggs and sprinkle with chopped almonds mixed with 4 Tbl sugar and 1 tsp cinnamon. Bake approx. 10 min until light pink-brown color. Do not over bake.




