

Easter Story Cookies 1 cp w

To be made the evening before Easter Sunday

1 cp whole pecans pinch of salt wooden spoon

1 tsp vinegar 1 cp sugar tape

Preheat oven to 300 (this is important)

Place pecans in a zipper baggie and let children beat them with wooden spoon to break into small pieces -After Jesus was arrested, he was beaten by the Roman soldiers (John 19:1-3)

Let the children smell the vinegar then put 1 tsp vinegar into the mixing bowl. When Jesus was thirsty on the cross, he was given vinegar to drink (John 19:28-30)

Add egg whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life. Jesus gave His life to give us life-(John 10:10-11)

Sprinkle salt into the children's hands, and let them taste it. Brush rest into bowl. This represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers, and the bitterness of our own sin-(Luke 13-27)

Add 1 cup sugar. The sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because He loves us-(Psalm 33:8, John 3:16 and more passages.)

Beat with a mixer on high speed for 13-15 minuets until stiff peaks formed. The color white represents the purity of God's eyes of those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus-(Isaiah 1:18 & John 3:1-3)

Fold in broken nuts. Drop by teaspoons into wax paper covered cookie sheet. Each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid-(Matthew 27:57-60.)

Put the cookie sheet into the oven and close the door and turn the oven OFF. Have the children tape the oven door. Jesus' tomb was sealed-(Matthew 27-65-66)

GO TO BED! Explain that they may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven overnight. Jesus' followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed-(John 16-20 and 22)

On Easter morning, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. See the cracked surface and take a bite. The cookies are hollow! On the first Easter, Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty-(Matthew 28:1-9)
